OBJECTIVE

To provide information regarding the City's annual Compost Giveaway.

BACKGROUND/DISCUSSION

On Saturday, April 7, 2018, the annual Compost Giveaway Event (event) will be held at the Municipal Service Center. This drive thru event, which is hosted by the City's waste hauler, Republic Services, will provide up to 60 gallons of free compost to Garden Grove residents. The event begins at 8:00 am and will continue until supplies run out. The purpose of the event is to close the loop on this material that has been diverted from the landfill and is ready to be used for gardening. The event has historically received a large turnout every year, serving approximately 150 households. Information is currently available on the City's website.

Garden Grove supports your efforts to extend the deadline for meeting State seismic compliance requirements for existing hospital operations, inclusive of the eight basic services and psychiatric care at Community Hospital of Long Beach (Community Hospital). The City is requesting this extension to enable acute and psychiatric care to continue while a long-term solution for seismic compliance at this hospital is identified and implemented.

Community Hospital is a 158-licensed bed, general acute care and psychiatric care hospital located at 1720 Termino Avenue in Long Beach. The facility is a valued component of our City's emergency response resources. Garden Grove understands that to be a hospital in California means to have a duly constituted governing body with overall administrative and professional responsibility and an organized medical staff that provides 24-hour inpatient care, inclusive of eight basic services: medical, nursing, surgical, anesthesia, laboratory, radiology, pharmacy and dietary services. Community Hospital currently meets these basic requirements and provides psychiatric care services.

Garden Grove residents have made it clear they would like to see the doors of Community Hospital remain open. Likewise, the City is highly interested in identifying a viable solution that allows the facility to operate while also meeting State seismic requirements for hospitals.

The League, California State Association of Counties and the County Engineers Association of California on March 29 honored the City of Mill Valley as the overall winner of the 2018 Outstanding Local Streets and Roads Award.

Given annually each spring during the Public Works Officers Institute, the awards recognize creative and cost effective projects that improve local streets, roads and bridges.

“People expect their local governments to wisely invest their tax dollars in their communities and implement cutting edge solutions in delivering local services,” Charles Herbertson, president of the League’s Public Works Department and director of Public Works for Culver City. “The projects receiving awards today show the ways in which cities and counties can deliver much-needed transportation improvements that are cost-effective, environmentally sound and help make our streets, roads and bridges safer.”

Mill Valley’s Miller Avenue Streetscape Plan received top honors for this project the need to improve critical infrastructure and safety features while preserving the city’s character. The Miller Avenue Streetscape Plan is the first comprehensive design with a primary goal of creating a safe and efficient multi-modal corridor consistent with the complete streets principles of design, including features to accommodate all users – vehicles, transit, bicycles and pedestrians. Governor Urged to Direct Resources in Budget to Modernization of Emergency Preparedness Assets

Year-Round Fire Danger Places New Demand on Local Fire Agencies

April 5, 2018

With the release of the May Revise just weeks away, the League is part of an effort to urge Gov. Jerry Brown to prioritize additional funding for fire prevention and mutual aid support in his proposed FY 2018–19 budget.

California's Mutual Aid System needs a mechanism to reimburse local agencies for costs to "pre-position" firefighting resources. This budget request address is a cost effective investment that can save lives, structures and reduce the cost of disaster response.

California no longer has a traditional fire season that spikes in the highest heat of the summer and early fall. As last year's October and December destructive and costly wildfires illustrate, extreme fire conditions has become a year-round concern. This is ongoing danger has led the newly-formed Disaster Readiness for Safer Communities (DRiSC) to mobilize and urge the Governor to include an additional \$100 million for the Office of Emergency Services (OES) to assist local agencies prepare for and respond to fire emergencies. The League is a member of this coalition.

Advances in forecasting have increased the accuracy in predicting when extreme weather conditions are most likely to elevate fire risk to dangerous levels. Fire agencies must now be ready at all times to respond to large scale fire storms locally and throughout the state.

Through California's Mutual Aid System, agencies send first responders to major disasters in other areas when the threat is too large for local resources to handle on their own. Managed by OES, the Mutual Aid System is an effective critical reactive tool that is held up as a national model in firefighting and responding to other large scale disasters, however it must be modernized to address the reality of extreme weather and expanded fire risk.

The costs of responding to extreme disasters are staggering. A single mega fire exceed over \$100 in response costs. The California Department of Forestry and Fire Prevention (CAL FIRE) estimates that it spent \$700 million fighting fires, which was twice the amount of its allocated budget.

Pre-Positioning

The new normal of year-round fire danger means brings challenges to the Mutual Aid System, which must become proactive too, instead of primarily reactive.

In 2017, over 35,600 requests were made, of which 11,000, or 35 percent, were unfilled. Firefighting leaders need additional support to implement what is known as “pre-positioning,” which enables firefighting resources (equipment and first responders) to be on standby where and when weather conditions pose the greatest fire risk. Pre-positioning firefighting resources allows responders to attack and control fires quickly and aggressively, helping them save lives and homes.

Budget Request Will Enable Local Firefighting Agencies to Respond Faster and More Effectively

There is currently no mechanism to reimburse local agencies for the cost of pre-positioning, which is why DRiSC is requesting \$100 million to enable OES to accomplish two main goals:

- Reimburse local governments for the cost of pre-positioning firefighters and equipment in advance of identifiable risks under the California Mutual Aid System; and
- Upgrade emergency communications and resource dispatching capabilities.

League Los Angeles County Division President Urges Yes on Props. 68, 69 and 72

Four years ago – in what were inarguably simpler times – the turnout for California's primary statewide election dropped to just 18 percent, nearly the lowest point in California's history.

Today, just nine weeks before another statewide election, politics have become much more polarizing. I certainly hope that wave of activism will translate into higher turnout at the polls, because in addition to the many candidates on the June ballot there are also five statewide propositions including three that have been supported by the League: Proposition 68, Prop. 69, and Prop. 72.

Details on the June measures can be found at www.cacities.org/2018ballotmeasures, but quickly: Prop. 68 is a \$4 billion water and park bond that will help cities provide clean water and safe parks; Prop. 69 will ensure that the Legislature can't divert SB 1 transportation dollars from their intended purpose; and Prop. 72 allows property owners to add a rainwater capture systems without having to have it impact their property taxes.

The League will continue to be an advocate and organizer for issues that affect local government, but as members we must also do our part and support CitiPAC, the League's political action committee. The five propositions on the June ballot will be relatively easy to comb through compared to the 40+ that are currently vying for a spot on the November ballot, a number of which would be extremely problematic for local governments.

I encourage everyone to use their voice and their knowledge of these issues to educate others. This will be a long election year, but we have the tools and the ability to change minds if we work together.

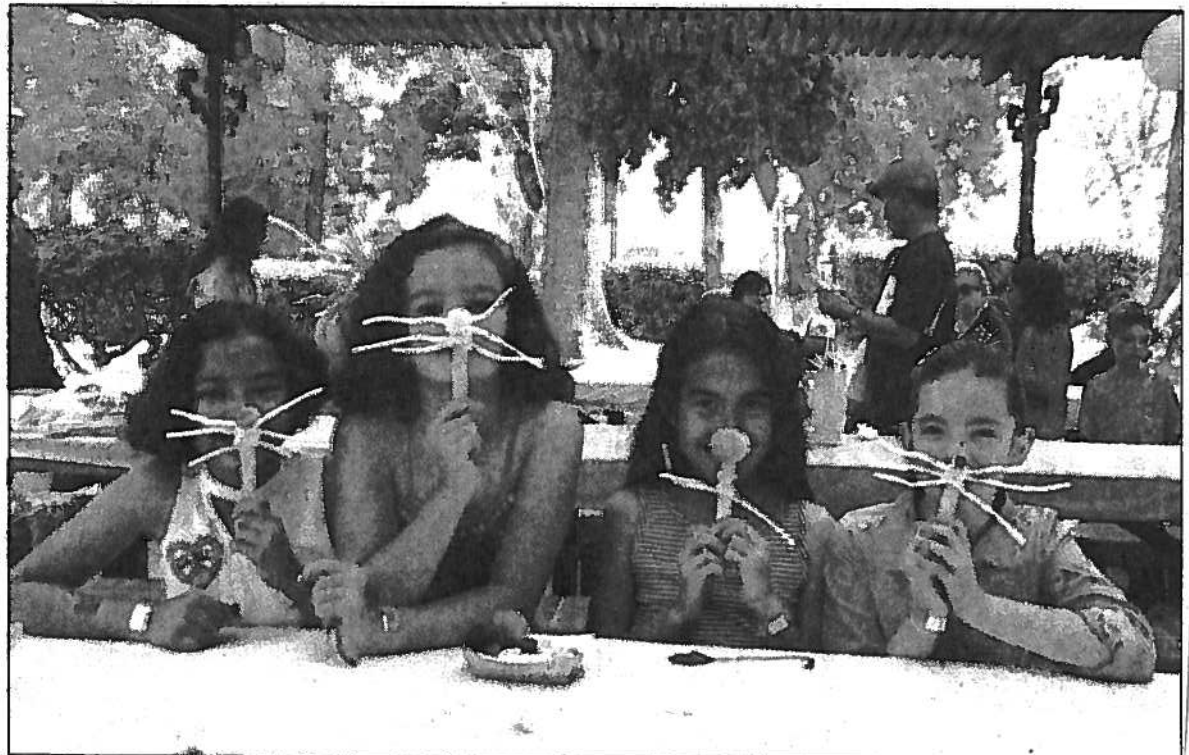

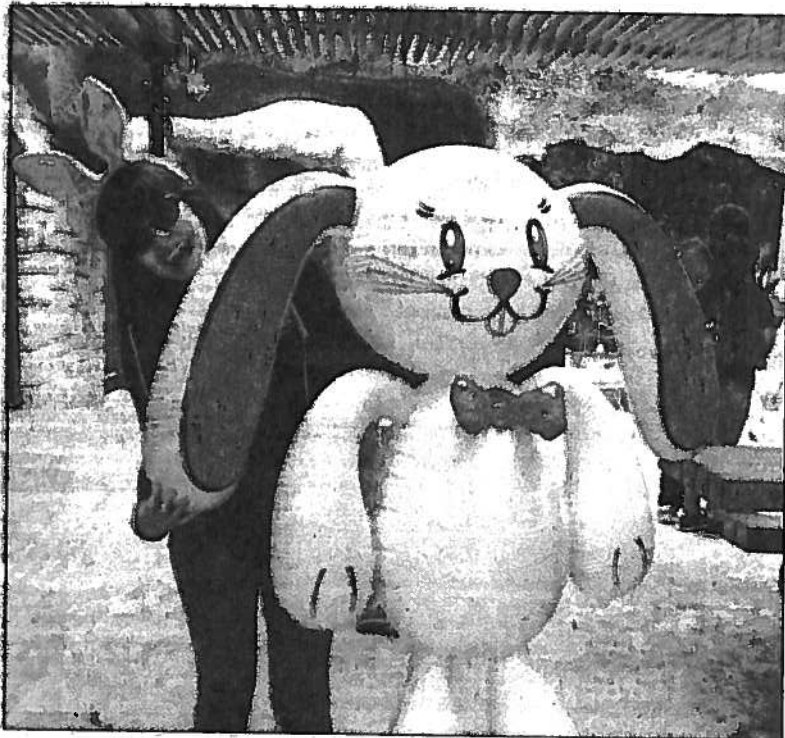

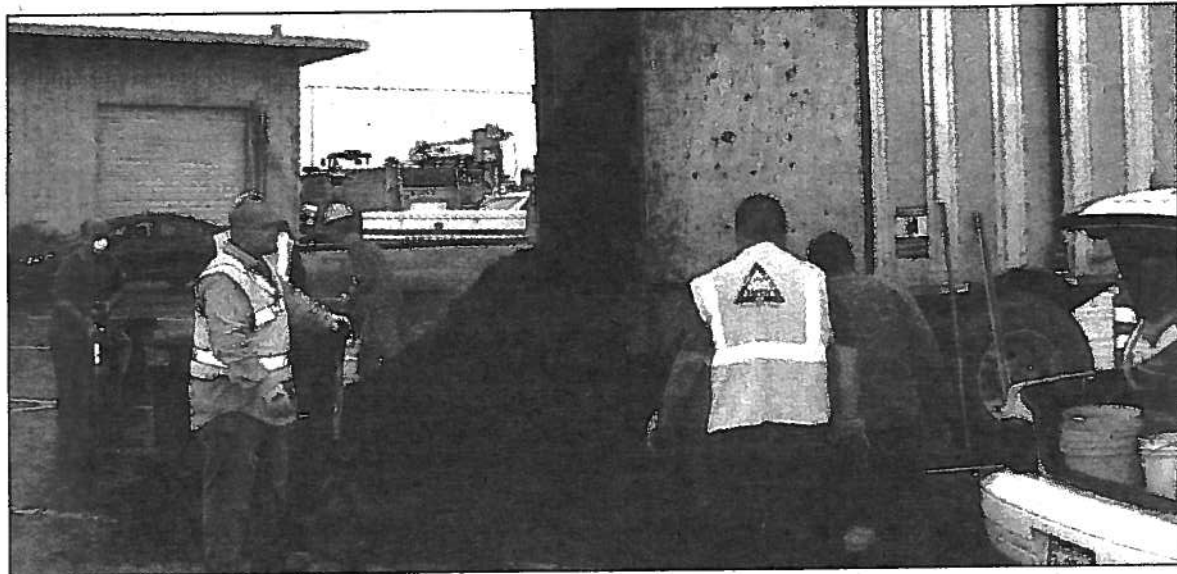

Orange County has 43 campuses among the state's 2018 California Distinguished Schools.

It is the state's top honor for public schools; overall achievement or significant improvement in scores are used in determining the designation.

Statewide, 287 schools received the honor, which had been on a hiatus while a new accountability system was established.

Last year, 29 O.C. middle schools and high schools were named California Gold Ribbon winners, which was the replacement designation. The award is typically rotated among elementary schools and the upper grade campuses.

"Our 43 local schools were recognized because they offer innovative educational programs that have helped meet both the academic and social and emotional needs of students," Orange County Superintendent Al Mijares said in a press release. "These campuses serve as examples of how all Orange County schools are working vigorously to prepare students for college and careers."

Campuses named Distinguished School are called on to share their "signature practices" with other educators, the county education department said.

OC Streetcar plans roll forward with selection of vehicles

Plans for Orange County's first modern streetcar rolled forward when the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) board of directors on Monday approved the purchase of the streetcars that will carry passengers on the route through Santa Ana and Garden Grove.

The contract with Siemens Industries, in the amount of up to \$51.5 million, will provide eight streetcar vehicles and spare parts and tools. The OC Streetcar route will have six vehicles in operation and two spare cars that can be rotated into the system as needed.

"This is an important and exciting milestone for the OC Streetcar project as we have decided upon the vehicles that will provide Orange County residents another public transit option," said OCTA Chairwoman Lisa Bartlett, also the Fifth District Supervisor. "We're looking forward to making the vision for a modern electric streetcar here in Orange County a reality."

The contract for the streetcars comes with the option to purchase up to 10 additional streetcars at a later date, if necessary. As part of the deal, Siemens will provide systems support and training to operators and maintenance technicians once the vehicles are delivered.

The OC Streetcar project is estimated to cost \$229 million, with funding coming from Measure M, Orange County's half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements, and a mix of state and federal funding.

OCTA has been working closely throughout planning and design with the Federal Transit Administration (FTA), which is considering a full funding grant agreement to pay for about half of the project's cost. Of that, \$50 million was included in the President's 2017 budget.

Because OCTA met all federal guidelines during the development of the project, FTA officials gave OCTA written pre-award authority to move forward with the purchase of vehicles. On March 23, Congress funded about \$2.6 billion toward Capital Improvement Grants funding, which is a promising signal for the OC Streetcar project to receive the full funding grant agreement.

The OC Streetcar will operate from the busy Santa Ana Regional Transportation Center, along Santa Ana Blvd. and Fourth St. and along the Pacific Electric right-of-way to Harbor Blvd. in Garden Grove.

The route will serve Santa Ana's thriving downtown and dense employment areas that include county and local government offices and courthouses in the Civic Center. The OC Streetcar route will also connect with many of OCTA's busiest bus routes and Metrolink commuter rail. It is expected to carry more than 7,300 passengers per day within its first year of operation.

The model of streetcar that Siemens will provide, called the S70 model, has proven successful in other cities nationwide. At least 342 streetcars of that model are in operation in eight U.S. cities.

The vehicles are 88 feet long and have 70 seats, carrying up to 180 passengers at a time. The streetcars will have doors on each side, operator cabs in the front and back, and level boarding—meaning no steps are required to enter or exit the streetcar.

This summer, the OCTA board will review branding of the OC Streetcar, which is expected to be similar to the blue, orange, and white branding of the OC Bus system.

Construction on the OC Streetcar is set to begin later this year with testing and operations beginning in late 2020.

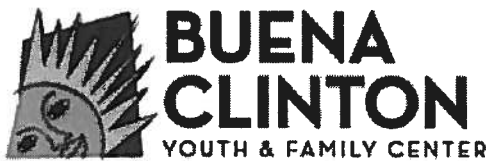
