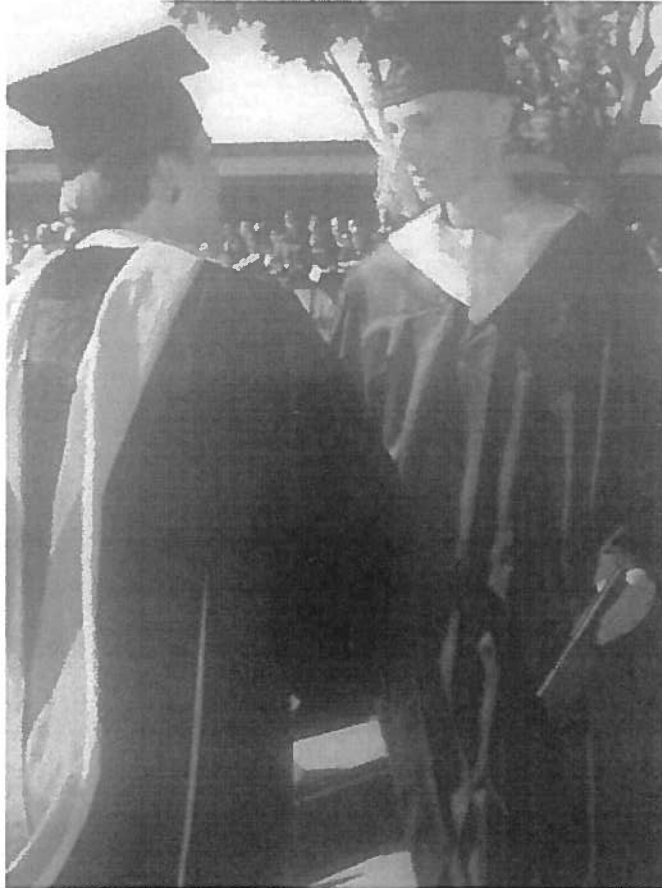

In Memory of Master Officer Howard E. Dallies #EOW March 9, 1993.

Master Officer Howard Dallies, Jr. began his law enforcement career with the Orange County Sheriff's Department, then went to the Placentia Police Department before becoming a #GardenGrovePolice officer five years later. Officer Dallies was known for being a quiet, patient and sincerely polite man.

On March 9, 1993 at approximately 2:45 am, Officer Dallies stopped the driver of a motorcycle on Aldgate St., east of Brookhurst. As Officer Dallies approached the motorcycle, the driver fired six shots at him, striking him four times. Officer Dallies was rushed to the hospital, where he succumbed to his injuries.

Homebuyer help

Attention, homebuyers
Or those thinking about buying a home in the near future.

The city is offering First-Time Home Buyer Programs for qualifying low-income families.

The CallHome loan is a 30-year deferred payment loan requiring no monthly payments, not exceeding \$80,000, which accrues 3-percent simple annual interest for the life of the loan. The loan is designed to assist with covering the difference between a qualifying mortgage amount and the actual price of a single-family home for qualified low- and very low-income families.

The city also offers the Workforce Initiative Subsidy for Homeownership Grant. The matching grant is up to \$15,000 that assists qualifying low- and very low-income families with the down payment or closing costs. For every dollar a resident puts towards the down payment, the city will match with three dollars.

There are openings available for the First-Time Home Buyer workshops which introduce potential Garden Grove homeowners to the process of buying a home, how to qualify for a home mortgage, and information regarding financial assistance programs offered through the city. The scheduled workshops for 2019 and 2020 are now available online at www.gccity.org/neighborhood-improvement. There are a limited number of spots available for these workshops.

Locals in Garden Grove, Westminster, Stanton and all over Orange County can't wait for the Angels' Opening Day.

"I will be there, in the nosebleeds, but there," said Doug Krone, of Garden Grove, who's been rooting on the Angels for 15 years.

The Angels face the Oakland Athletics at 1:07 p.m. on March 28 in Oakland.

Their home opener is at 7:07 p.m. on April 4. They host the Texas Rangers.

The Angels finished with a record of 80-82 last season. Man-

ager Mike Scioscia is hoping to improve on that.

How?

Here are five things to watch for during the 2019 campaign.

1) Kole Calhoun is better than he played last year, when he batted .208, with 19 homers and 57 RBI. He needs to produce, right up to his potential;

2) Shohei Ohtani was a sensation in spring 2018. A home run hitter with a 100 mph? Early in the campaign, he was notching 101 mph on the radar and pitched a perfect game through 7 innings before giving up a hit. At the plate, he was socking bombs (he finished with 22 homers in 104 games).

The second coming of Babe Ruth? That was the water-cooler talk.

Then he injured his elbow. Can he pitch and also be a regular player in the lineup? We'll see, but one thing is for sure: We need a healthy Ohtani to compete in the AL West;

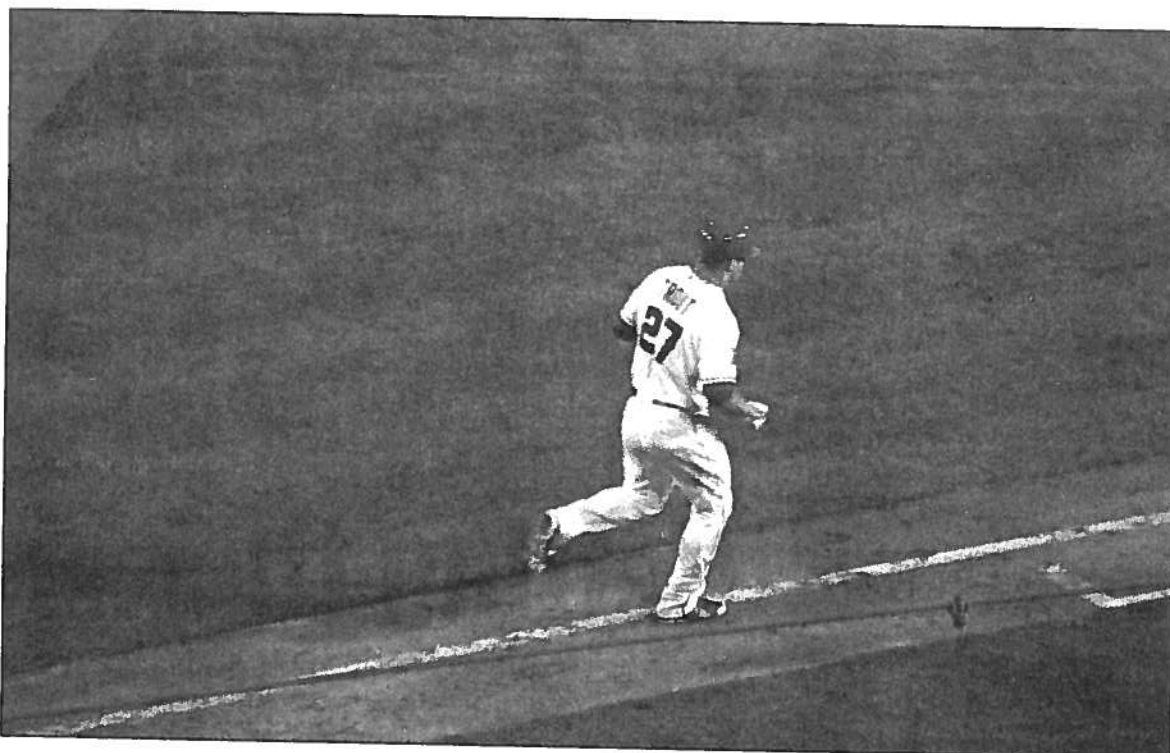
3) Speaking of pitching, we need to win by committee, because we don't have a Nolan Ryan in the starting rotation or a Troy Percival to close out games. That means projected starters Matt

Harvey, Andrew Heaney, Tyler Skaggs, Jamie Barria and David Fletcher are going to need a lot of help from the bullpen, and somebody's got to step up as a closer. Last season, the Angels had the second-most blown saves in the American League (23);

4) Consistent power hitting from Ohtani, Albert Pujols and

left-fielder Justin Upton is a must. This team is going to have to score a lot of runs because we don't have a proven, potent 1-2 punch in our pitching rotation, nor do we have an established closer;

5) Which brings us to Mike Trout — the best player in baseball and maybe the best since a young Barry Bonds.

What do you ask of a player who who's won two MVP awards and appeared in seven all-star games

at the age of 26?

Let's just say: Let Trout be Trout, and support him for who he is — the greatest player in franchise history — and for who he isn't: a showboat, a quote machine, a media darling.

He's a free agent and might not be around next season. Enjoy him while he's here.

Nine Westminster women to be honored by council; teens offer a free lunch

Westminster City Councilman Sergio Contreras will honor a diverse group of nine women who have "contributed to the quality of life in Westminster through their community service, professional achievement, integrity, and dedication to the well-being of others," according to a statement from Contreras' office.

The women whom Contreras describes as "often-unsung heroes who make Westminster a better place to live" include:

- Roxanne Chow, executive director of the Time To Give Back foundation, which works with children, seniors and others in need.

- Julie Chau Diep, founder of the OC Autism foundation, which seeks to connect families of people with autism with organizations and services.

- Louise Larsen, a community volunteer on issues including voter registration and get out the vote efforts, as well as founder of Parents of Kids with a Severe Peanut Allergy, a Facebook-based support group with more than 12,000 members.

- Gia Ly, past president of the Vietnamese-American Chamber of Commerce, which works on business initiatives throughout Southern California and Southeast Asia.

- Bich Phuong Nguyen, a philanthropist and composer.

- Hai Nguyen, a family advocate in the LGBTQ community and parent adviser at Viet Rainbow of Orange County.

- Dr. Sam Nguyen, founder of

the Stable Anchor Manor foundation, which works with homeless, runaway and at-risk youths.

- Claudia Steinmetz, a co-founder of Westminster Hope & Opportunity, which promotes volunteerism and volunteer projects to improve life in the city.

- Thuy Vy, vice-president of external affairs, Vietnamese Language and Culture Schools of Southern California.

The Peanut Butter and Jelly Project is run by the True Neighborhood Teens, a group of teenagers — you probably already figured that out — who live and volunteer in Garden Grove's Buena Clinton neighborhood.

During spring break a year ago they were able to provide PBJ lunches for 140 kids and they're hoping to feed 150 this year, a goal that would cost about \$1,800.

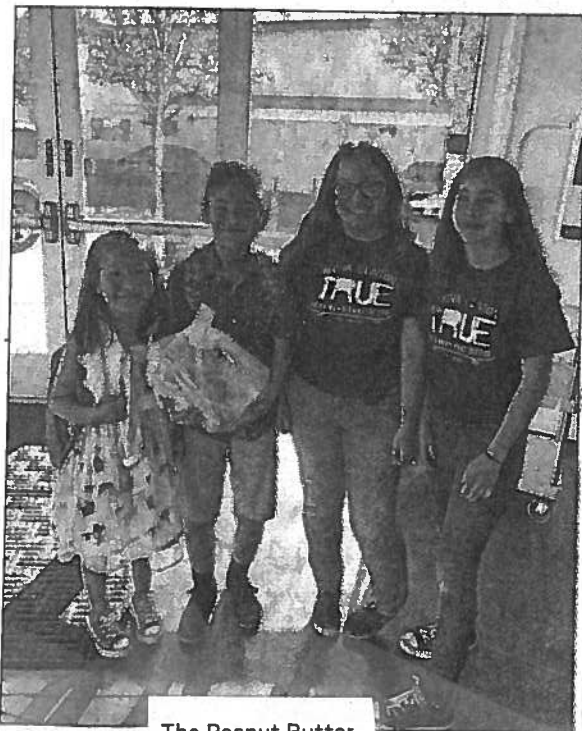

Northeast Garden Grove Little League had 84 players, on seven teams, when it held its season-opening ceremony Saturday at Pioneer Park.

It's not a big league by Little League standards. But for Northeast Garden Grove, it's mammoth.

Just a few years ago, the league was down to one team. That's about the time Ray Martinez took over as league president.

"This was my Little League back in the day, when I was 5 years old in 1984, and played all the way through

16 years old," said Martinez, a truck driver for Triumph Aerostructures in Hawthorne. "I couldn't see it die — so many memories, so many good times spent here."

Martinez's first season in charge was 2017, and he took quick action.

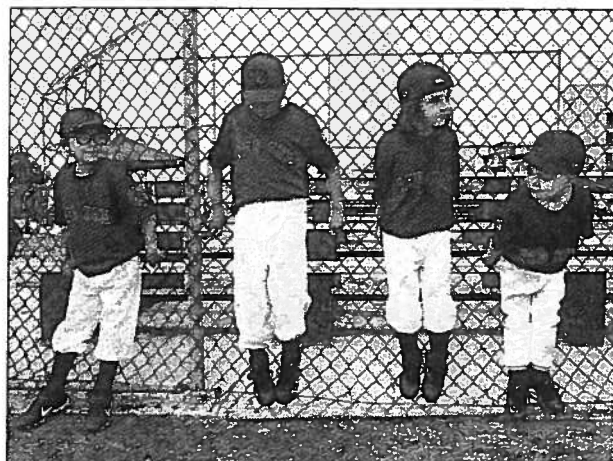
"We had 20 kids and it was already March," he said. "I had a meeting with all the parents who signed up and told them, 'Let's open it up.' I'm going to pay for all the kids who want to play in this league."

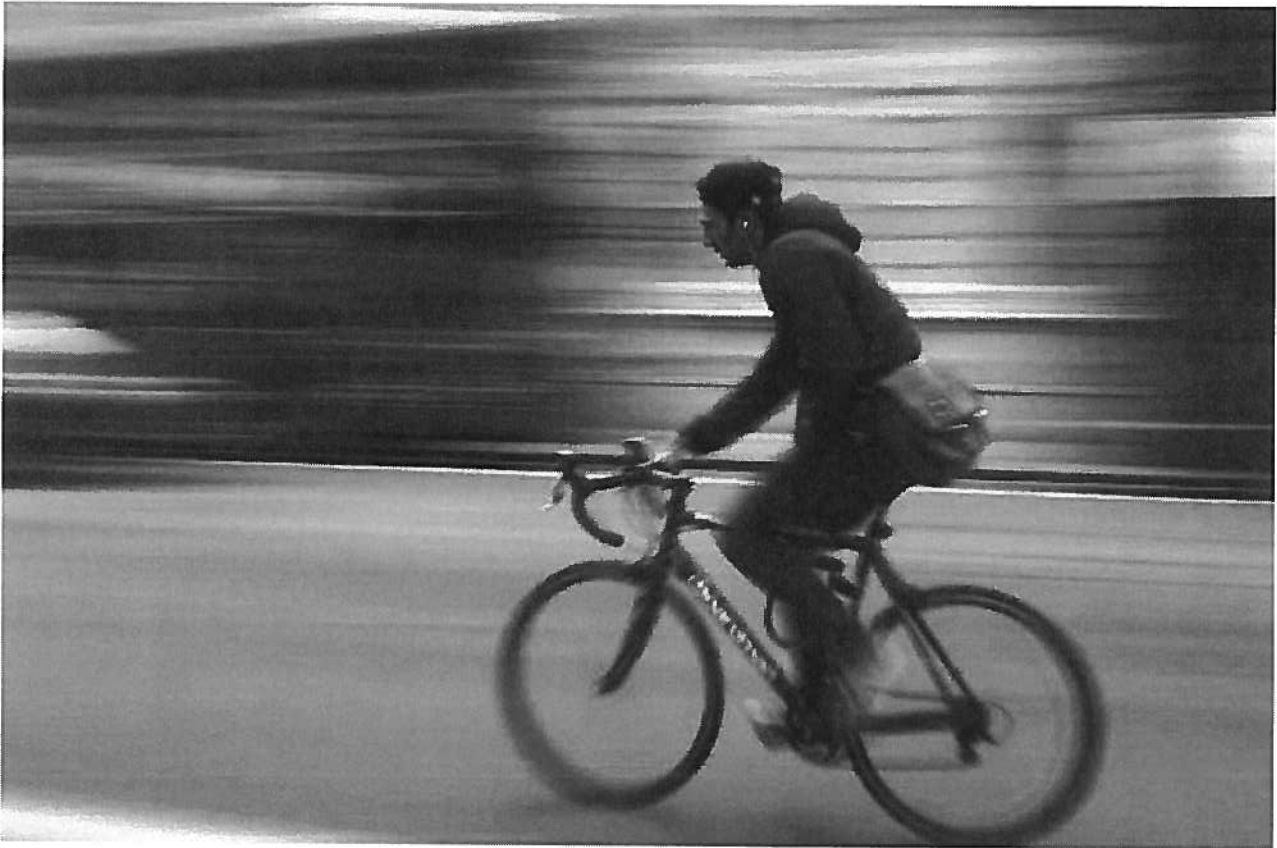

Townhomes, “BikeSafe” ok’d by council

A **PROGRAM** to prepare residents for the expansion of bike paths in the city was approved by the Garden Grove City Council on Tuesday (Flickr/Nuno Ribeiro).

Approval was given Tuesday night by the Garden Grove City Council for the construction of a 31-unit townhome project at 9861 11th St.

The council voted 7-0 in favor of the proposed planned unit development located west of Brookhurst Street on a 1.8-acre lot. The land is currently occupied by a 59-bed facility for the developmentally delayed which is planned for

closure in May.

(https://orangecountytribune.files.wordpress.com/2016/07/gg-logo_lg.jpg) Melia Homes will be building the complex in two- and three-story versions.

Also on Tuesday night, the council approved the appropriation of \$73,880 in state grant money to prepare residents for the coming expansion of bike paths in the city.

The city won a \$1.8 million grant to expand the bicycle and pedestrian trail along the former Pacific Electric right-of-way from Stanford Avenue to Brookhurst Street.

To encourage youth and others to safely use the new path, which will link the downtown area of the city to the Brookhurst-Chapman shopping district, the “BikeSafe Garden Grove” program would work toward creating 10 events each year – 30 over three years – toward that end.

The next meeting of the council is set for Tuesday, March 26 at 5:30 p.m.

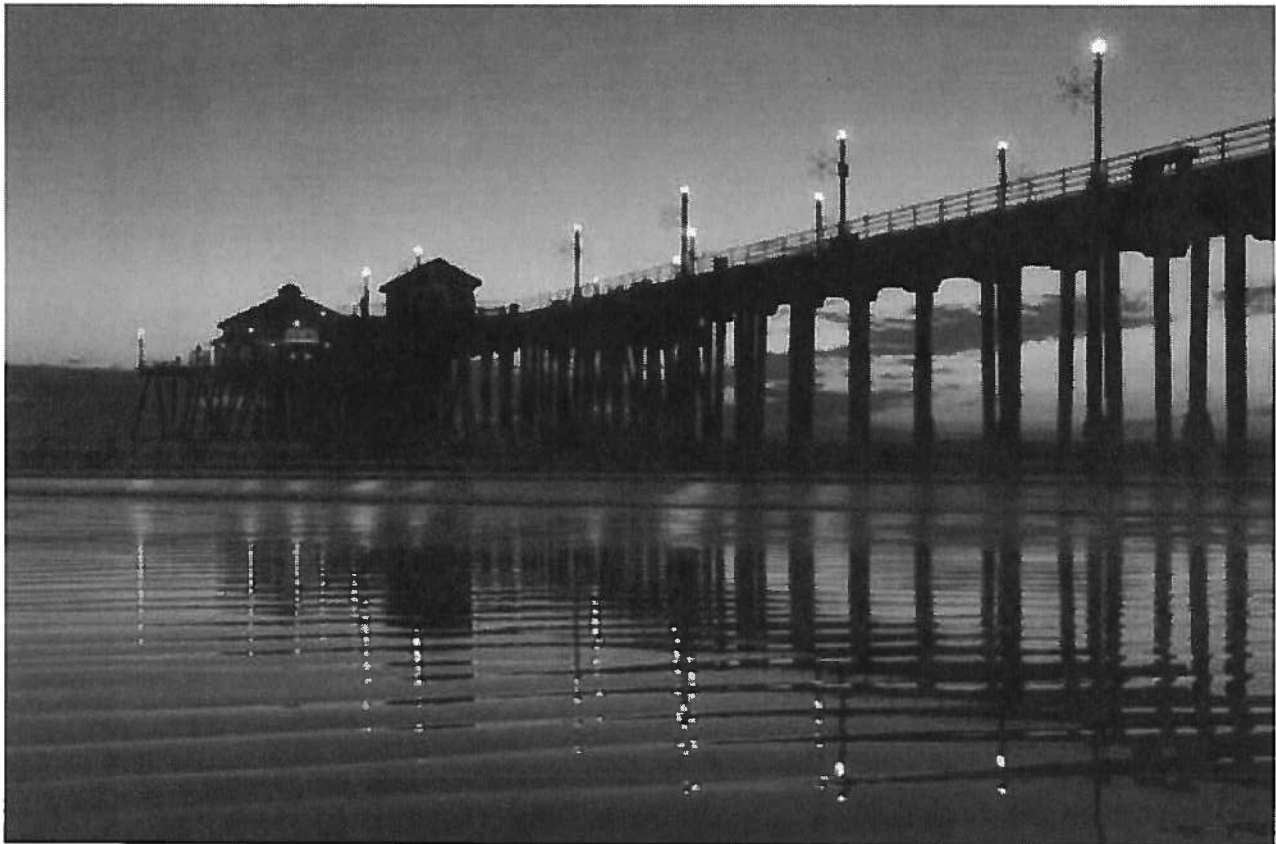

These amendments increase and define affordability standards, strengthen renter protections, detail jobs-rich community requirements, and further protect sensitive communities

San Francisco — Today, Senator Scott Wiener (D-San Francisco) announced amendments to Senate Bill 50, the More HOMES Act, to increase and define affordability standards, strengthen renter protections, detail jobs-rich community requirements, and further protect sensitive communities. These amendments come after months of stakeholder meetings and engagement to strengthen SB 50's effectiveness in addressing California's housing crisis, while protecting against displacement of low-income renters and sensitive communities. SB 50 creates new zoning standards for the construction of housing near job centers and public transportation. It eliminates hyper-low-density zoning near transit and job centers, thus legalizing apartment buildings in these locations so that more people can live near transit and near where they work. It also reduces or eliminates minimum parking requirements for new developments.

"California is in a deep housing crisis, and we need bold solutions to close our state's 3.5 million home deficit," said **Senator Wiener**. "Our housing shortage is threatening California's environment, economy, diversity, and

quality of life. We need more housing at all income levels, and we need to focus that housing near transit and near where people work. I'm grateful to the stakeholders who are working on this to make SB 50 as good as it can be."

"Increasing housing next to transit and jobs is smart land use, and so are the new amendments to SB 50 that ensure affordable units are included and sensitive communities are safeguarded," said **Senator Nancy Skinner**(D-Berkeley). "I'm proud to co-author SB 50."

The amendments introduced on March 11th will:

Amend in a more specific definition of job-rich area:

A jobs-rich area is defined as an area with positive educational and economic outcomes for households of all income levels, or its proximity to jobs, as measured by job totals and employment density, would allow people to live close to where they work, or new housing developed in this area would help to reduce vehicle miles traveled. *A map outlining job-rich areas will be available in advance of SB 50's first committee hearing.*

Redefine major transit stop to include *planned* rail/ferry stations:

The language requirement as to what transit stations are included in the bill will remain the same, except that now any area within a ¼ or ½ miles of a planned rail or ferry station will also be rezoned under the bill. This mirrors language in previous state policy, such as SB 375.

Amend in the specific methodology for identifying sensitive communities:

Within the Bay Area, sensitive communities will match the map that was developed and approved with deep regional stakeholder input at CASA, the Committee to House the Bay Area. Outside the Bay Area, the methodology to identify sensitive communities will be a combination of a high percentage of households living under the poverty line and indicators of racial segregation in the census tract.

Include tenants of mobile home parks in definition of protected tenants:

Tenants in mobile home parks will now have the same protections as other tenants in order to protect against displacement.

Outline mandatory affordable housing requirements for SB 50 projects:

The minimum inclusionary zoning requirements range from 15-25% for low-income units, deepening on the size of the project, and includes options to meet the requirement by providing very- or extremely- low income units.

SB 50 sets minimum inclusionary zoning standards. If a local inclusionary program has requirements in excess of SB 50, the local program applies.

Provides flexibility for developers to pay fees in lieu of building affordable housing on site while requiring that that affordable housing to be built within a ½ mile of the original location or prove that the project is affirmatively furthering fair housing.

Add a cross reference into the Housing Accountability Act:

This will clarify that SB 50 projects must be considered consistent with applicable planning standards, and therefore protected under the HAA.

SB 50 is supported by the State Building and Construction Trades Council, the California League of Conservation Voters, AARP California, the Natural Resources Defense Council, CALPIRG, Environment California, the California Apartment Association, Habitat for Humanity, the Non-Profit Housing Association of Northern California, the San Francisco Housing Action Coalition, the California Renters Legal Advocacy and Education Fund (CaRLA), and a host of other renter, business, and labor organizations. It also enjoys bi-partisan support from members of the Legislature and support from numerous mayors and city council members from around the state including San Francisco Mayor London Breed, Oakland Mayor Libby Schaaf, Sacramento Mayor Darrell Steinberg, San Jose Mayor Sam Liccardo, Stockton Mayor Michael Tubbs, and Los Angeles Mayor Eric Garcetti has made positive statements regarding the direction of the bill.
