



The site is adjacent to the Santa Ana River on the east, the Pacific Electric (PE) Right-of-Way on the north, and abuts Garden Grove's Buena Clinton neighborhood. To the east across the Santa Ana River, is Spurgeon Intermediate School and Spurgeon Park. To the west of the site is the Santa Anita neighborhood of Santa Ana. Directly to the south, is Cesar Chavez Campesino Park.


Monthly Water Usage Data, Tier 2 Projection & Water Supply Information

The attached figures show the recent trend of water consumption in Orange County (OC), an estimate of Imported Water Sales for MWDOC, and selected water supply information.

- OC Water Usage, Monthly by Supply OCWD Groundwater was the main supply in July.
- OC Water Usage, Monthly, Comparison to Previous Years
 Water usage in July 2018 was above average compared to the last 5 years. We are continuing to see slight increases in overall water usage compared to the previous two Fiscal Years. In June 2016, all water conservation became voluntary for MWDOC agencies and the Great California Drought was declared over by the Governor in April 2017.
- Historical OC Water Consumption Orange County M & I water consumption is estimated to be 540,000 AF in FY 2018-19 (this includes ~15 TAF of agricultural usage and non-retail water agency usage). This is about 15,000 AF more than FY 2017-18 and is about 36,000 AF more than FY 2016-17. Water usage per person is projected to be slightly higher in FY 2018-19 for Orange County at 155 gallons per day (This includes recycled water). Although OC population has increased 20% over the past two decades, water usage has not increased, on average. A long-term decrease in per-capita water usage is attributed mostly to Water Use Efficiency (water conservation) efforts. O.C. Water Usage for the last three Fiscal Years is the lowest since the 1982-83 Fiscal Year (FY1982-83 was the third wettest year on record).

<u>Water Supply Information</u> Includes data on Rainfall in OC; the OCWD Basin overdraft; Northern California and Colorado River Basin hydrologic data; the State Water Project (SWP) Allocation, and regional storage volumes. The data have implications for the magnitude of supplies from the three watersheds that are the principal sources of water for OC. Note that a hydrologic year is Oct. 1st through Sept. 30th.


- Orange County's accumulated rainfall through August was well below average for this period. Water year to date rainfall in Orange County is 3.66 inches which is 29% of normal.
- Northern California accumulated precipitation through August was around 84% of normal for this period. Water Year 2017 was the wettest water year on record. The Northern California snowpack was 43% of normal as of April 1st. The State of California was in a declared Drought Emergency that started January 2014 and ended in April of 2017. As of late August, 47.58% of California is experiencing moderate to extreme drought conditions while 86.22% of the state is experiencing abnormally dry conditions. The State Water Project Contractors Table A Allocation has increased to 35% as of late May.
- Colorado River Basin accumulated precipitation through late August was 69% average for this period. The Upper Colorado Basin snowpack was 71% of normal as of April 3. Lake Mead and Lake Powell combined have about 58% of their average storage volume for this time of year and are at 42.6% of their total capacity. If Lake Mead's level falls below a "trigger" limit 1,075 ft. at the end of a calendar year, then a shortage will be declared by the US Bureau of Reclamation (USBR), impacting Colorado River water deliveries to the Lower Basin states. As of late August, Lake Mead levels were 3.5' above the "trigger" limit. The USBR predicts that the start of 2019 will not hit the "trigger" level but there is a 52% chance that the trigger level will be hit in 2020 and a 64% chance in 2021.




Accumulated Precipitation

Police in Garden Grove fatally shot one suspect while responding to a report of a domestic dispute on Tuesday, Sept. 18.

Authorities received reports of a woman screaming, shouting that she could not breathe in the parking lot of the Ralphs store at 12051 Euclid St., near Chapman Avenue, according Lt. Carl Whitney, a spokesman for the Garden Grove Police Department. He said that, there, police found a 46-year-old man attacking a 43-year-old woman inside a silver Hyundai Sonata.

"The guy was strangling his wife and wouldn't stop," witness Nick Zuanich told a videographer near the site of the shooting. "The cops tried to stop him and he wouldn't stop, so they shot him."

Officers shot the man at some point after making contact with him, according to Whitney. He said the suspect was treated at the scene by officers before paramedics transferred him to a local hospital.

There he was pronounced dead at 3:38 p.m., according to a Tuesday night news release by the department. It said the woman he had been attacking was taken to another hospital with minor injuries.

Further details regarding the relationship between the man and woman or additional circumstances of the shooting were not immediately available from authorities.

Some patrons of the Ralphs supermarket had to wait hours before getting back to their cars as detectives searched a portion of the parking lot cordoned off by yellow police tape. Investigators from the Orange County District Attorney's Office and the Garden Grove Police department are looking into the incident.

The Garden Grove Unified School District has expanded its mental health resources to provide greater social emotional support for all students.



The social work program is one of many mental health services offered through the district's Department of Special Education and Student Services. All GGUSD schools have access to at least two to three hours of counseling per week by a credentialed GGUSD school proactive strategies to promote psychologist thanks to an increase in the total number of school psychologists from 23 to 39, which provides a stronger network of mental health care for district students.

In addition, each district school has at least 10 hours of direct counseling hours that, districtwide, equate to more than 23,000 hours. These hours are provided through strong partnerships that GGUSD has with four cont-

racted community-based organizations.

Over the last several years, the district has placed a targeted focus on creating positive school climates within our schools. While all schools provide a safe and supportive learning environment, 35 schools have implemented Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS). Additionally, 14 schools implemented programs that directly teach students social-emotional skills. One such program is classroom mindfulness, which teaches students resiliency and selfregulation. Four schools also are using restorative practices through community classroom circles to build positive relationships and increase classroom engagement.

Having it your way on the right-of-way

BIKE PATHS and walking trails along the old P.E. right-of-way could be taking on a new dimension.

Transportation news in Orange County used to revolve mostly around what kind of car you were going to buy, and what could be done about the nightmare at The Orange Crush (now only slightly less crushy).

In a Facebook post a few days ago, Garden Grove Mayor Steve Jones took the unofficial wraps off an intriguing idea for the long-abandoned Pacific Electric right-of-way, which runs diagonally like a scar through Orange County from Buena Park to Santa Ana.

(https://orangecountytribune.files.wordpress.com/2018/01/usually-reliable-sources-e1527735160254.jpg)Responding to a question about more bike paths and parks, he wrote this:

"It's already in the works ... We are planning to build out the old Pacific Electric right-of-way into a bicycle and pedestrian path with kiosk restaurants and retail along the way. We are also implementing our 'Pedals and Feet' master plan to better connect the city with active transportation routes."

How cool is that? You can burn off the calories from the burger or taco you ate along the way by pedaling home.

The bike and pedestrian paths we've heard about, but the restaurants and retail are new to us. The city has received grants to take the section that runs from the downtown area northwest to Brookhurst Street and turn it into something lovely for cyclists and walkers. That's only a portion of the total route, but if the mayor's concept comes to fruition it would add a lot of parkland to the city and subtract a lot of wasted space.

A new West Side Story?

Folks in the West Grove area (that's West Garden Grove) have been concerned for a while about what they feel is a drain of retail and eating opportunities in their area, which is primarily along Valley View Street.

There may be some good or at least interesting news coming. The Urban Land Institute held a workshop in July on what they're calling the Valley View Corridor and we are told that the report – with recommendations, we presume – should be out in mid-October.

The Tribune, of course, will be reporting on that, and the full report will be posted online when it becomes available.

An historic note: a similar report on the Harbor Boulevard corridor a decade or more ago helped kick-start the development there which is still ongoing with four more hotels

approved and on the drawing boards.

"Our" OC Streetcar could be just the start ...

If you're into trying to gaze into a crystal ball to see what the future holds – as we do – one interesting place to gaze is into the Long Range Transportation Plan put forth by the Orange County Transportation Authority.

Even allowing for the reality that a lot of what's suggested is "blue sky" thinking that may never come to pass, it's still thought-provoking to see what might be coming our way.

Some of the notions presented in the executive summary of the report include:

- adding a car pool lane along portions of Pacific Coast Highway.
- adding a regular lane along the Newport (55) Freeway between the Garden Grove (22) Freeway and the Santa Ana (5) Freeway.
- adding "high quality transit" along the Harbor Boulevard Corridor between Cal State Fullerton and downtown Santa Ana.
- adding "high-quality transit" between the Goldenwest Transportation Center (near Golden West College and the Bella Terra shopping center) and UC Irvine.

- adding "high-quality transit" along the Beach Corridor between the downtowns of Fullerton and Huntington Beach.
- adding "high-quality transit" along the "Main Corridor" between the Anaheim ARTIC transportation center and South Coast Plaza.

Now, there are no specifics about what "high-quality transit" would mean, but we doubt it refers to a few more buses. Putting all that together suggests to us that the OCTA might like to consider a county-wide streetcar or similar system if the OC Streetcar project connecting Santa Ana and Garden Grove (almost ready to start construction) is successful.



Police fatally shoot man in market lot

GARDEN GROVE police shot a man in a supermarket parking lot Tuesday afternoon.

A 46-year-old man is dead after being shot by a Garden Grove police officer Tuesday afternoon in a supermarket parking lot. According to Lt. Carl Whitney of the GGPD, the incident took place around 3 p.m. in the lot of the Ralph's supermarket at Euclid Street and Chapman Avenue.

Police were called in response to witnesses seeing a man attacking a woman inside a silver Hyundai Sonata; the woman begged the man to stop, saying she couldn't breathe.

An officer arrived within minutes of receiving the call and found the Hyundai near the store's east entrance doors. He confronted the man and "an officer involved shooting occurred," said Lt. Whitney.

The suspect was shot and the officer rendered first aid. The suspect – described as a transient – was transported to a local trauma center where he died of his injuries at 3:38 p.m. The woman, 43, a resident of Garden Grove, had minor injuries and was taken to another hospital for treatment. The officer was not injured.

Police believe the man and woman were known to each other. The incident is being investigated by the Orange County District Attorney's office and the GGPD. The identity of the man is being withheld pending a preliminary investigation and notification of the next of kin.

Another fast food eatery could be coming soon to the downtown area. When the Garden Grove Planning Commission meets on Thursday, Sept. 20, it will consider site plan approval for a Taco Bell restaurant in what is now the parking lot of the Home Depot store.

Fountainhead Shrugged LLC is proposing to build a new 2,485-square foot restaurant with a drive-thru lane on the western portion of the lot facing Grove Avenue, north of Garden Grove Boulevard.

The downtown area is already home to a Del Taco, McDonald's and a Starbucks. The SteelCraft development now under construction on Euclid Street two blocks to the west will add 14 new eating and drinking spots to the city' original commercial core.

Also on the agenda is an application for a one-year time extension for the construction of a new service station with a new drive-thru convenience store on a vacant lot at 7051 Garden Grove Blvd., west of Knott Street.

Additionally, the planners will consider a general plan amendment to adopt a bicycle and pedestrian plan and to add the Garden Grove Active Streets Master Plan as an appendix.

The commission meets at 7 p.m. in the council chamber in the Community Meeting Center, 11300 Stanford Ave.

These hours are provided through strong partnerships that GGUSD has with four contracted community-based organizations.



Over the last several years, GGUSD has placed a targeted focus on creating positive school climates within our schools. While all schools provide a safe and supportive learning environment, 35 schools have implemented Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS). PBIS helps staff and students by using proactive strategies to promote positive school wide behavior.

Additionally, 14 schools implemented programs that directly teach students social-emotional skills. One such program is classroom mindfulness, which teaches students resiliency and self-regulation. Four schools also are using restorative practices through community classroom circles to build positive relationships and increase classroom engagement.

GGUSD serves most of Garden Grove and portions of Santa Ana, Anaheim, Westminster, Cypress, Stanton, and Fountain Valley.

League of California Cities 2018 Annual Conference REPORT Orange County Division Membership Elects 2019 Board of Directors

The City of Long Beach welcomed more than 1,800 city officials last week for the League of California Cities' Annual Conference & Expo. The Annual Conference featured over 40 educational sessions, 267 exhibitors and three informative general sessions.

Attendees celebrated the League's 120th Anniversary and individual city accomplishments, applauded the installation of the League's 2018–19 officers and board of directors, learned about innovative practices in California cities throughout the state, and adopted policy resolutions.

The opening general session also featured a video highlighting the League's accomplishments spanning its 120 year history and remarks from Long Beach Mayor Robert Garcia who welcomed attendees to the city.

Executive Director Carolyn Coleman delivered her State of the League address during a general session on Thursday, Sept. 13.
