Enclosed is the October 2018 Investment Report which shows the financial institutions, types of investment instruments, monthly transactions, current month interest received, and the par and fair market value of investments held. The month-end cash in the bank and petty cash balances are also listed on the Cash and Investment Report. The pie chart (please see chart on attachment A) reflects the investment instruments as a percentage of the total portfolio.

This investment portfolio meets State guidelines and adheres to the City's investment policy. As of October 2018, the City's total portfolio is invested in:

The cash with fiscal agents is restricted as they are funds held and invested by an outside fiscal agent. The restrictions were set forth in the related bond indentures. As of October 2018, 7.260% of the portfolio is restricted.

In summary, the investment portfolio is secured and the City has the necessary cash to pay its bills for six months in a timely manner. Please call me at extension #5060 if you have any questions.

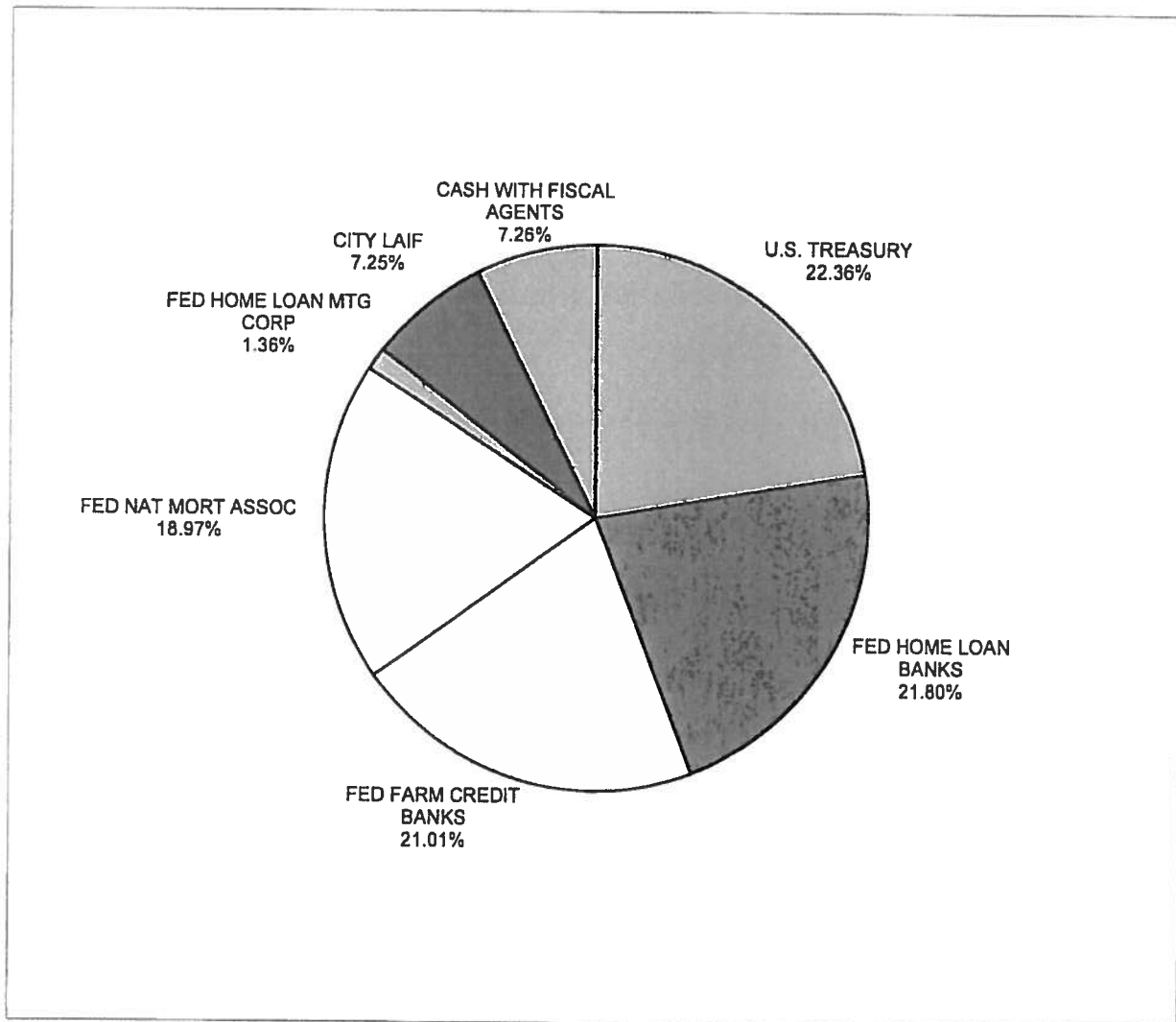

FISCAL IMPACT

The DOJ grant program does not require a match from the City. The expected yearly cost includes a full-time contractual Code Enforcement Officer, operating expenses, enforcement supplies, and administrative costs. There is no impact to the City's General Fund.



OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide an update regarding the Senior Home Improvement Grant Program.

BACKGROUND

The City annually receives grant funds from the Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) to undergo projects and administer programs benefiting low/moderate income Garden Grove residents.

Administered directly by the Neighborhood Improvement Division, the Senior Home Improvement Grant (SHIG) Program makes available grant funds of up to \$5,000 to correct code violations and carry out eligible home repairs for low/moderate-income senior homeowners. Eligible exterior home repairs include the installation of safety mobility and security devices, paint, window replacement, and roof repair/replacement. The SHIG Program also provides for interior repairs that address major system issues such as plumbing, heating, electrical, and handicap accessibility.

DISCUSSION

Since Fiscal Year 2016-17, the City has assisted 39 senior homeowners with home improvement grants totaling \$195,000 in federal funds. During the current Fiscal Year, City Staff anticipates providing an additional 35 grants totaling \$186,000 in federal funds. The table below provides an activity overview of the SHIG Program.

Additionally, each grantee is required to undertake a home inspection for lead-based paint to ensure the safety of the homeowner and their guests. By the end of the current program year, the City will have caused to be inspected nearly 80 homes at a cost of approximately \$25,000 in federal funds.

A program of this nature is extremely important as senior citizens are one of Garden Grove's most vulnerable populations. The average annual income of a Senior Home Improvement Grant recipient is \$18,000. Many grantees express gratitude as the grant funds facilitated necessary repairs to their homes that would not have been possible without the City's help.

SUMMARY

The Neighborhood Improvement Division is committed to maintaining the sustainability of its housing stock through the continued administration of the Senior Home Improvement Grant program.

OBJECTIVE

The purpose of this memorandum is to provide first quarter highlights for the Emergency Solutions Grant Program.

BACKGROUND

The Neighborhood Improvement Division of the Community and Economic Development Department is the administrator of the Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG). In Fiscal Year 2018-19, \$167,285 dollars in funding has been allocated to four organizations (City Net, Thomas House, Interval House, and Mercy House) to provide services to the city's homeless population. Each organization recognized as a sub-recipient are required to submit a quarterly report detailing services provided.

DISCUSSION

Staff is pleased to report the first quarter activities for the ESG Program for Fiscal Year 2018-19.

Street Outreach (City Net)

In collaboration with the Special Resource Team (SRT), City Net primarily provides street outreach services to augment the SRT enforcement efforts. Street outreach is designed to provide essential services to unsheltered individuals and families. The essential services that are provided through street outreach are: engagement, case management, emergency health and mental health services, transportation, and services to special populations.

During the first quarter, City Net engaged 81 clients and expended \$5,815 dollars of their annual budget. Out of the 81 clients that were engaged, City Net provided case management services to 27 clients, 23 of which were able to exit the streets into shelters or permanent housing. City Net was able to assist 81% of their annual

projection of Garden Grove clients while only expending 23% of their total annual budget.

Emergency Shelter (Thomas House, Interval House and Mercy House)

The City of Garden Grove funds three organizations to provide emergency shelter services to Garden Grove's homeless population. The eligible activities that are funded through emergency shelter are: case management, child care, education services, job training, health services, legal services, life skills training, mental health services, substance abuse treatment, transportation, and shelter operations (facility rent, security, insurance, food, and supplies).

- Thomas House assisted 4 clients during the first quarter and expended \$3,803.80 dollars. Thomas House has assisted and expended 13% of their total annual service projection.
- Interval House assisted 21 clients during the first quarter and expended \$7,296 dollars. Interval House has served 30.4% of their annually projected clients and expended 19.8% of their budgeted funds.
- Mercy House have not assisted any clients during the first quarter and have expended \$2,170 dollars. Mercy House has expended 21.7% of their budgeted funds during the first quarter. Mercy House operates as a seasonal winter armory and serve the homeless during the cold winter months.

Rapid-Rehousing (Interval House)

In addition to emergency shelter services, Interval House provides rapid-rehousing services to the homeless population in Garden Grove. Rapid-rehousing services assist individuals and families who are literally homeless, and can include short and medium-term rental assistance, housing relocation, and stabilization services.

Over the first quarter, Interval House provided rapid-rehousing services to 4 clients and expended \$14,370 dollars of their annual budget for rapid-rehousing. Overall, Interval House was able to assist 26.6% of their annually projected clients and expended 30.5% of their annual budget for rapid-rehousing.

Homeless Prevention (Mercy House)

Mercy House provides homeless prevention services to Garden Grove's homeless population. Homeless prevention services support individuals and families who are at an imminent risk of being homeless. Homeless prevention services include housing relocation, stabilization services, as well as short and medium-term rental assistance. Mercy House provided rental assistance to 6 clients over the first quarter and

expended \$827 dollars of their annual budget. Mercy House was able to serve 30% of their annually projected clients while only expending 4.3% of their annual budget for homeless prevention.

CONCLUSION

The Neighborhood Improvement Division continues to proactively monitor each sub-recipient to ensure services to the city's homeless population are achieved.

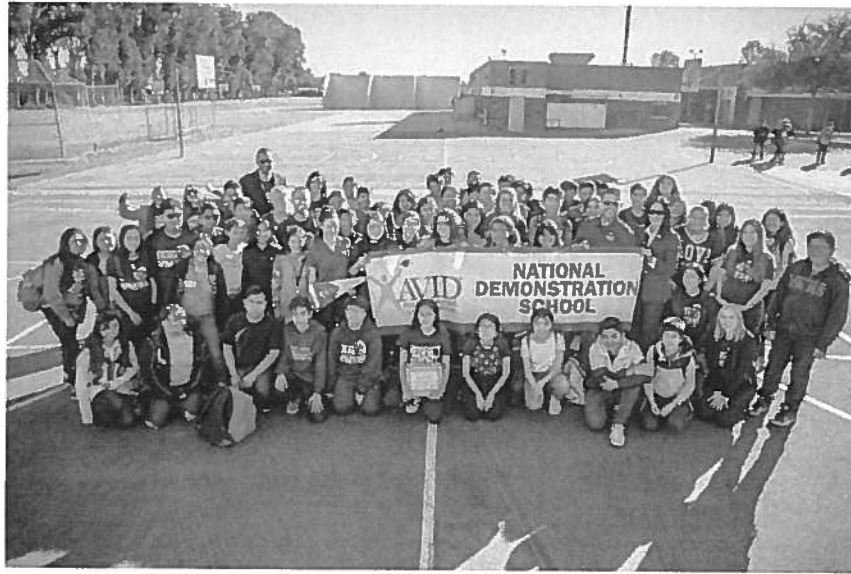
Violette Students Get Wise About Water

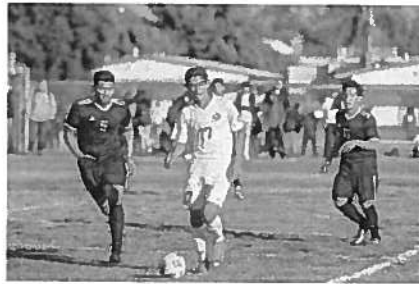
Doig Intermediate is Re-Validated as AVID National Demonstration School

Protest: Policy 'shameless, immoral, inhuman'

**Locals try to protect
Vietnamese immigrants; feds
maintain hard-core stance
against "criminal aliens"**

Hundreds took to the streets of Little Saigon on Saturday to protest President Donald Trump's effort to deport thousands of Vietnamese immigrants with criminal records.

Signs bobbed all over Bolsa Avenue and other streets in Little Saigon. One read "Keep Families Together." Another stated, "Deporting Vietnam War Refugees is Shameless, Immoral, Inhuman."

"People have to get together and stop this," protester Fran Sosa said. "We have to treat it with the kind of severity that it deserves."

About 200,000 people live in Little Saigon, most of which is in Garden Grove, Westminster and Santa Ana.

Lobbying efforts in the nation's capital are feverish.

The Trump administration is attempting to reverse a pact signed by former President George W.

Bush – and supported by former President Barack Obama – that protects the residency status of those who immigrated from Vietnam from 1975 to 1995.

The administration is targeting those with criminal records.

The Department of Homeland Security issued a statement: “We have 7,000 convicted criminal

aliens from Vietnam with final orders for removal.”

The administration has stated that these are non-citizens who were arrested and ordered removed under previous administrations.

Earlier this year, President Trump said sanctuary cities are a big part of the problem.

“Sanctuary cities release thousands of criminal aliens out of our prisons and jails and back into our communities,” he said at a

roundtable in the Roosevelt Room.

“They go into those sanctuary cities when they see them; they go there because they feel they’re

safe. And in many cases, they are very bad actors. We have gang members; we have predators, rap-

ists, killers. A lot of bad people.”

Westminster is not a sanctuary city. Earlier this year, the City Council formally opposed a law declaring California a sanctuary state. Garden Grove is not a sanctuary city. Santa Ana, however, is a sanctuary city.

The administration’s stance is not popular among Vietnamese-Americans in Orange County and may have contributed to incumbent State Senator Janet Nguyen, a Republican, losing her

District 34 seat to Democrat Tom Umberg in November.

District 34 includes Garden Grove and Westminster.

Many others support Trump’s stance.

“You have to come in legally,” said Manny Rodriguez, who was visiting over the weekend from Los Angeles. “That’s all he’s saying. And if you’re a criminal, you’ve got to go. He’s cleaning house and I support him 110 percent.”

Homebuyer help at hand

City programs assist those seeking to get into market

The City of Garden Grove is now offering First-Time Home Buyer Programs for qualifying low-income families.

The CalHome loan is a 30-year deferred payment loan requiring no monthly payments, not exceeding \$60,000, which accrues 3-percent simple annual interest for the life of the loan. The loan is designed to assist with covering the difference between a qualifying mortgage

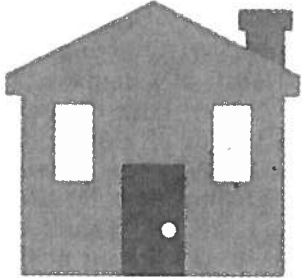
amount and the actual price of a single-family home for qualified low- and very low-income families.

The city also offers the Workforce Initiative Subsidy for Homeownership Grant.

The matching grant is up to \$15,000 that assists qualifying low- and very low-income families with the down payment or closing costs. For every dollar a resident puts towards the down payment, the city will match with three dollars.

There are openings available for the First Time Home Buyer workshops which introduce potential Garden Grove homeowners to the process of buying a home, how to qualify for a home mortgage, and information regarding financial assistance programs offered through the city.

The workshops will take place on Jan. 5, 2019 and Feb. 2, 2019, from 9 a.m. to noon.

Quirk-Silva fights Trump, sides with immigrants

Assemblywoman opposes plans to deport thousands of Vietnamese

Assemblywoman Sharon Quirk-Silva released the following response to the Department of Homeland Security reportedly meeting with Vietnamese government officials this week to discuss drastic changes to the terms of an agreement that has governed the deportation of individuals to Vietnam since 2008.

Quirk-Silva joins many families in Orange County in opposing any changes to the agreement that would erode protections currently afforded to Vietnamese immigrants, including a provision that does not permit those who entered the United States before July 12, 1995 to be deported.

"I want to express my concern over the latest actions of the Trump

administration this week. Any actions that prioritize harsher restrictions such as these should be made with a diplomatic, and more level-headed approach," said Quirk-Silva.

"Southeast Asian Communities, including Vietnamese communities, and all the proud Asian Pacific Islander communities of Orange County should not be made to fear being arrested and deported. The refugee story in Orange County is proof that the American Dream is alive and well. People fleeing their home only for their safety, and the safety of their children, should be respected and not feared."

Modifications to the U.S. - Vietnam Repatriation Agreement could potentially make over 8,500 individuals immediately vulnerable to deportation. Many of these community members came to the United States as refugees, fleeing war and persecution, and have lived here peacefully for decades.

This Ordinance approves zoning text amendments to Sections 9.16.020.020.A.4 and 9.16.020.050.AJ of the Garden Grove Municipal Code modifying the development standards for hotels located in the C-3 (Heavy Commercial) zone. This Ordinance allows a Floor Area Ratio up to 1.0 for hotels and 0.55 for all other uses in the C-3 zone. As many as 16 new positions in the police department are expected to be created to fight crime and preserve order in Garden Grove as a consequence of the approval of the Measure O one-cent sales tax increase by Garden Grove voters on Nov. 6

At a press conference in City Hall on Tuesday afternoon, city leaders unveiled plans – still to be approved by the city council – to beef up law enforcement in the Big Strawberry.

(https://orangecountytribune.files.wordpress.com/2016/07/gg-logo_lg.jpg) City Manager Scott Stiles began by saluting voters for their approval of the tax levy. “We want to thank our community for showing confidence that we will use Measure O revenues so that great services will be continued to be provided to Garden Grove.”

He added “We have been determined to come out of the gate with immediate action steps that we believe reflect the wishes of the community when they approved Measure O.”

The proposal includes the recruitment of:

- 10 full-time police officers;
- one full-time police sergeant;
- five new police support personnel (dispatchers, records specialists, community service officers).

Such recruitment will begin immediately, with a focus on bilingual officers.

Additionally, one full-time police officer would be dedicated to the Special Resources Team, which addresses issues related to homelessness.

(<https://orangecountytribune.files.wordpress.com/2016/09/ggpd.jpg>) Police chief Todd Elgin told the press and others at the conference “Today is a great day for the Garden Grove Police Department.” He outlined how the city had changed from a bedroom community into what’s becoming a “big city.”

He praised the work of an undermanned police force and said, “Now ... now we have the chance to do something great.”

Currently there are 168 sworn personnel positions in the GGPD, down from a peak of 175 in 1998. Garden Grove has generally had the smallest police force per capita of any Orange County city.

Improvements aren’t limited to more personnel. A new public safety building – to replace the current one, which dates back to the early 1970s – is envisioned with the creation of requests for proposals to design a new facility.

The sales tax to pay for all of this doesn’t kick in until April 1, 2019, and the funds won’t be available until July 2019. Given the time necessary to recruit and hire new officers, the new and additional officers probably won’t start duty until January 2019.

Additionally, the city council will create a citizen oversight committee to monitor the use of Measure O funds.

**CITY MANAGER ANNOUNCES IMMEDIATE START OF
MEASURE O PUBLIC SAFETY PLAN**

Yesterday, Garden Grove City Manager Scott Stiles held a press conference to announce the immediate roll-out of the City's new public safety plan resulting from the passage of Measure O, a one-percent sales tax approved by 65 percent of Garden Grove voters in November, which goes into effect on April 1, 2019. The plan focuses on: the recruitment of 16 additional police officers and police support personnel; the addition of one full-time police officer to the police department's SRT (Special Resources Team) homeless task force; the creation of an RFP (request for proposal) for long-term police facility improvements; and the development of the Measure O Community Oversight Committee in early 2019.

Stiles opened the conference by thanking the Garden Grove community for their support of Measure O.

"First and foremost...we want to thank our community for showing confidence in the City to use Measure O revenue to ensure great services are continued in Garden Grove," said Stiles.

According to Stiles, the City will immediately begin recruitment efforts to fill the following positions: ten full-time police officers; one full-time police sergeant; and five police support personnel (dispatchers, records specialists, community service officers).

Garden Grove Police Chief Todd Elgin supported the critical need to hire additional police officers and civilian personnel, citing the decreased number of sworn officers unable to keep up with the growing needs of Garden Grove's nearly 180,000 residents, due to budget constraints.

"From 1997 to 1998, the number of Garden Grove sworn police officers peaked at approximately 175. Today, we have 168, which says a lot about how understaffed we are. Measure O funding will allow us to be more effective with confronting the increased crime rates and our increasing homeless population," said Chief Elgin.

Both Elgin and Stiles spoke about the issues associated with the homeless population as ongoing concerns, confirming that Measure O funding would also be used to assist the efforts of the police department's SRT homeless task force, and provide for the immediate hiring of one full-time officer dedicated to the SRT.

Stiles also announced the creation of an internal team to develop an RFP to secure firms that will design needed upgrades to existing police facilities covering the next 30 years. According to Chief Elgin, the police department headquarters in the Garden Grove Civic Center is 50 years old, and unsuitable to accommodate additional police personnel.

Stiles ended the press conference by speaking about a report to be presented to the City Council at the start of 2019, containing recommendations for the Measure O Community Oversight Committee, which will serve as an advisory group to the Garden Grove City Council on the use of Measure O funds. Measure O funds will not be available to the City until July 2019.

Garden Grove Mayor Steve Jones, and members of the Garden Grove City Council were also on-hand to lend their support to the plan, which must receive approval by the Garden Grove City Council prior to implementation.

"This is what our community wanted, and it's what we said we'd deliver. That's why it has my wholehearted support, as well as the support of my City Council colleagues," said Mayor Jones during the press conference.

GARDEN GROVE - Sau khi được cử tri Garden Grove thông qua Dự Luật "O" trong cuộc bỏ phiếu ngày 6 tháng 11, 2018, vào lúc 4 giờ chiều thứ Ba, 18 tháng 12, 2018, ông Scott Stiles, Tổng Quản Trị Thành Phố Garden Grove đã tổ chức một cuộc họp báo tại lầu 3 Tòa Thị Chính Garden Grove, 11222 Acacia Parkway, Garden Grove để thông báo kế hoạch an toàn cộng đồng cho thành phố, trong đó có việc tuyển thêm nhiều nhân viên cảnh sát biết hai ngôn ngữ.

Ông cũng bày tỏ sự cảm ơn các nhân viên trong Tòa Thị Chính đã sát sảng để cùng với ông soạn thảo ra những đề án nhằm đem lại sự an toàn công cộng cho thành phố, trong đó có việc tuyển thêm 10 nhân viên cảnh sát toàn thời gian, đặc biệt tập trung tuyển dụng các nhân viên biết hai ngôn ngữ như tiếng Việt, tiếng Hàn quốc tiếng Tây Ban Nha v.v., tuyển dụng thêm một trung sĩ cảnh sát toàn thời gian và 5 nhân viên hỗ trợ cảnh sát (điều phối, chuyên viên hồ sơ, nhân viên phục vụ cộng đồng).

Và ông chú trọng đặc biệt đến việc thành lập Đội Tài Nguyên Đặc Biệt (Special Resources Team) để giải quyết vấn đề người vô gia cư, đồng thời xây dựng một cơ sở mới cho Sở Cảnh Sát thành phố.

Sau đó, ông mời Thị Trưởng Steve Jones phát biểu. Ông Thị Trưởng cảm ơn ông Tổng Quản Trị Thành Phố đã đưa ra những kế hoạch an toàn cho thành phố và có lời cảm ơn tất cả cử tri trong thành phố đã bỏ phiếu cho dự luật "O" để thành phố chúng ta có thêm phương tiện giúp cho người dân được an toàn hơn.

Cảnh Sát Trưởng, ông Todd Elgin được mời phát biểu. Ông Elgin cho biết, dự luật "O" rất quan trọng đối với ông cũng như đối với Cảnh Sát Garden Grove, vì từ lâu rồi họ không có cơ hội được giúp cộng đồng cách tốt hơn cũng như giúp chính người cảnh sát của mình, nay qua dự luật "O", ông tin rằng cảnh sát có cơ hội phục vụ tốt hơn, và vì thế ông có lời cảm ơn cộng đồng đã bỏ phiếu cho dự luật "O", và ông hứa những ngân quỹ dành cho cảnh sát sẽ được dùng vào những việc mà ông đã hứa với cộng đồng.

Dự đoán, nhờ dự luật này, mỗi năm thành phố Garden Grove có một tài khoảng chừng \$19 triệu Mỹ kim để giúp cho các dịch vụ an toàn trong thành phố như lời ông Tổng Quản Trị Scott Stiles đã trình bày ở trên.

Ngoài ra, dự luật "O" cũng giúp thành phố không phải cắt giảm nhân viên cảnh sát, cứu hỏa; duy trì thời gian phản ứng khẩn cấp 9-1-1; duy trì tuần tra an ninh, phòng chống ma túy và băng đảng hầu đem lại an ninh cho cư dân và các cơ sở thương mại.

Dự luật "O" sẽ có hiệu lực vào ngày 1 tháng Tư, 2019 nhưng ngân quỹ do dự luật này mang lại phải mãi đến tháng Bảy, 2019 mới có.

League-Sponsored Bond Agency Issues Nearly \$252 Million in Tax-Exempt Bonds for Hospital in Arcadia

The League's co-sponsorship of the California Statewide Communities Development Authority (CSCDA) continues to be one of the most significant benefits for League members.

CSCDA announced the issuance of \$251.78 million in tax-exempt bonds Methodist Hospital of Southern California (MHSC), based in Arcadia.

About Methodist Hospital

MHSC is a nonprofit general acute care hospital providing a range of inpatient and outpatient services in the San Gabriel Valley in northeastern Los Angeles County. MHSC currently has 348 licensed beds, is a Medicare 5-Star rated hospital, and treats more than 50,000 patients in the Emergency Department each year. The facility is outfitted with advanced diagnostic technology including a 320-slice CT scanner and high-definition MRI. MHSC also manages state-of-the-art catheterization labs, electrophysiology and neuro-interventional radiology.

CSCDA partnered with KeyBanc Capital Markets and Orrick, Herrington & Sutcliffe, LLP to provide the \$251.78 million in tax-exempt bonds for MHSC. The bonds will be issued to refinance a taxable loan, significantly reducing MHSC's annual debt service payments.
