Dear Congressman Correa:

As you know, the Housing Choice Voucher Program is the largest program in the Section 8 family of programs, providing rental assistance to nearly 2.3 million very low-income families nationwide, giving them the opportunity to rent privately-owned units in the locations of their choosing. This vital program serves a wide variety of participants in our community including families, seniors, persons with disabilities, households displaced by disasters, and homeless families from shelters.

The Garden Grove Housing Authority is allocated **2,337** vouchers, and yet current funding is only sufficient to support approximate **95%** of the full allocation. With full utilization of funding, the housing authority is only able to assist **2,220** families. To more effectively meet the housing needs in our community, I would like to respectfully request your support in advocating for sufficient funding to fulfill Garden Grove's full allocation for the Housing Choice Voucher Program. At this time, there are approximately 14,000 applicants on the waiting list to receive rental assistance.

Thank you for your continued support and consideration. We look forward to providing you with regular updates regarding the status of this very important program.

# Westminster Avenue Closure From Harbor Boulevard to Enterprise Drive


OC Streetcar crews will be working day and night shifts to build a column support structure for the Westminster Avenue Bridge. To accommodate this work, a full closure of Westminster Avenue, from Harbor Boulevard to Enterprise Drive, will be in effect on the following dates:

- Wednesday, December 4, from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Thursday, December 5, from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m.
- Friday, December 6, at 7 p.m. though Monday, December 9, at 5 a.m.

Possible nighttime closures may be in place Monday, December 9, through Wednesday, December 11, from 7 p.m. to 5 a.m. each night.

Please note, construction schedules are subject to change.

Detour routes will be in place through Clinton Street and Fairview Street. Please follow detour signage and plan for possible delays.



# OUR MOBILE HOMES AMBASSADOR: SON DO

PRESIDENT OF OC MOBILE HOMES RESIDENTS COALITION HELPS US BRING WEATHERIZATION SERVICES TO 23 HOMES IN HIS ASSOCIATION

Son Do has been a resident of Orange County for 24 years, since he immigrated from Vietnam in 1996. He is the President of the Orange County Mobile Homes Residents Coalition, helping residents to get their space rental benefits and educating them about community services that they are eligible for. He is in charge of mobile home parks in Westminster, Santa Ana, Stanton and Garden Grove.

Son first heard about CAP OC and WAP 2 years ago, when our former eligibility technician Kim Nguyen attended one of his coalition meetings. He had a great experience getting his mobile home weatherized and has been working to bring weatherization services to other homes in his association. In 2019, 23 mobile homes that he oversees has been weatherized by CAP OC.

"The experience I received from CAP OC was excellent," Son said. "I would be very grateful if my entire community could receive a similar experience. I believe this could be achieved if CAP OC could advertise in

the Vietnamese newspaper, radio, TV and social media."

At an Oct 18 meeting of his mobile home coalition, Son signed a Proclamation for CAP OC, declaring October as Energy Action Month and October 30th as Weatherization Day and recognizing the work that CAP OC has done in his community.

We are proud to partner with Son in bringing life-changing weatherization services to community members in need. As we make an effort to reach out to neighborhoods and communities that we have not yet served, we will look to his guidance in helping us reach some of these households.



# Industrial complex in Garden Grove sells for \$34 million

Rexford Industrial has acquired 12752-12822 Monarch St. in Garden Grove for \$34 million.

Kevin Shannon, Scott Schumacher, Ken White, Jeff Read and Bret Hardy with Newmark Knight Frank represented the seller, Penwood Real Estate and Western Realco. Rexford Industrial was selfrepresented.

The property, built in 1971 and expanded in 1980, includes a four-tenant industrial building with 276,585 square feet on 11.1 acres; it's almost fully occupied, according to NKF.

Rexford Industrial in a statement said it intends to reposition the property with "functional and cosmetic improvements" while replacing a portion of the building with other improvements.

NKF said west Orange County's submarket is one of the county's more desirable markets due to its access to major freeways. Seven cities make up the submarket with Huntington Beach to the west and south, Garden Grove farther east and Cypress to the north. The industrial product types in the region are a combination of warehouse/ distribution, manufacturing and low-rise R&D/flex space, the brokerage said.

# Rain to hit Southland this morning

Residents in Southern California may again want to have umbrellas handy as more rain was set to hit Tuesday night into today, forecasters with the National Weather Service said.

This storm wasn't expected to be as intense or cause road closures through the Grapevine or the Cajon Pass like last week's, said Tom Fisher, a meteorologist with the NWS's Oxnard office.

counties, while moun-commute, Fisher said. tain areas may see up to 2 inches between Tuesday night and tonight, forecasters said.

This storm was being driven by low pressure coming from the south and the west, said Adam Roser, a meteorologist with the San Diego office.
